Autumn vaccinations – staff clinics If you live in or around Aberdeen, there will be drop-in vaccination clinics for health & social care staff at Airyhall (Springfield Road) and Bridge of Don (Cairnfold Road) **this** Saturday (16 September) between 9.30am - 4pm.

If you'd prefer an appointment, you can see which clinics are bookable via the online booking portal. Please remember to select staff vaccination, as staff clinics will not display if you choose another option e.g., you are eligible because you're over 50, or because you are pregnant. Details of staff clinics across Grampian have been attached to the email used to send out this brief; please note the ARI clinics only have very limited appointments left. Please read the list carefully, as staff clinics are a mix of drop-in only and appointment only. Members of the public can **only** get vaccinated by appointment. **You must bring your staff ID to a clinic, whether you have an appointment or are dropping in.**
