**Storm Babet** As shared earlier, new Red and Amber weather warning have been issued across different parts of Grampian, taking effect from midnight tonight. The full update is on the Met Office website, and we would encourage everyone to read this and understand what it means for them: <a href="https://www.weather.warnings-Met Office"><u>UK</u></a> weather warnings - Met Office. You should also follow your relevant local authority for the latest information on road closures or other service disruption.

SSEN are reminding all customers to call 105 to report any loss of supply or damage to power lines. You may also wish to download their Power Track app, which will give you details of power outages and restoration times.

The poor weather and road closures have disrupted our catering deliveries. We have not received a bread delivery in Aberdeen today and as such inpatient wards may run out supplies for toast at breakfast. If deliveries resume tomorrow service will return to normal for Sunday breakfast; if not, there will be very limited supplied until Tuesday. In addition, there may have to be some menu changes over the weekend, as catering adapt to the supplies available. Wards will be informed of this directly. Inpatient wards in Aberdeenshire and Moray will NOT be affected by this. Catering apologises for any inconvenience; these circumstances are completely outwith their control.

Please do everything you can to keep yourself and your patients/clients safe.
