Important update on mandatory training for all NHS Grampian employees Public Protection Level 1 Module has replaced the previous standalone Level 1 modules for Public Protection, Child Protection, Adult Support & Protection & PREVENT. All staff, whether patient facing or not, will be required to complete this mandatory training which delivers all the learning objectives for Public Protection, Child Protection, Adult Protection & PREVENT within one module.

The new module has been updated to reflect the latest guidance and legislation and takes approximately 30 minutes to complete which significantly reduces the time demands on staff of the previous 4 modules.

From today (22 January) the old modules will be deleted, therefore you will **not** receive the usual reminder to refresh your learning. To be compliant with your mandatory and statutory training obligations, please share this information with your colleagues and teams and ensure as many of you as possible complete the new training module as soon as possible. This will ensure your learning is up to date and you will then receive your reminders to refresh every 2 years.

Research highlights effectiveness of HPV immunisation Research by Public Health Scotland, alongside the Universities of Edinburgh and Strathclyde, has found NO cases of cervical cancer have been detected in those fully vaccinated against HPV. The immunisation was first offered back in 2008 and is now part of the routine programme, offered to all pupils in S1. HPV is a sexually transmitted infection, responsible for almost all cases of cervical cancer. The full story is on the PHS website.

UNCRC Incorporation (Scotland) Bill - In exciting news, the UNCRC Bill to incorporate children and young people's human rights into Scots law received Royal Assent last week. This means it is now an Act and will come into force on 16 July. Work has been going on 'behind the scenes' for some time to ensure we are prepared for incorporation and more information will be available through the Child Health Commissioner's monthly newsletter.
