Standard Operating Procedure – Respiratory & non-respiratory pathway allocation, testing, and reporting A new Standard Operating Procedure has been developed, incorporating the latest guidance on respiratory and non-respiratory pathways of care. It has been attached to the email used to send out this brief. Please use this document going forward.

Single Use Plastic Ban From 1 June 2022, Scotland will be the first UK nation to ban some of the most environmentally damaging single-use plastic items. This means that it will be an offence to manufacture and supply these items in our services. A full list of the items to be banned – and therefore removed from Pecos for purchase – is available here (intranet link, networked devices only). If you currently have any of the listed items in stock, please use them **before 1 June**. Otherwise, all plastic items can go into dry mixed recycling bins, and polystyrene items can go into general waste bins. Information on replacement items will follow.
