Dress policy Following feedback from the public, we want to remind everyone that surgical scrubs should never be worn outside hospital buildings. Scrubs are only for those staff with responsibilities in operating theatres, or if your usual uniform has become contaminated. Everyone required to wear a uniform must follow the NHS Grampian Dress Policy. There may be occasions when you must wear uniform outside of the workplace, but in these instances, the uniform should be covered with an over garment.

Medical Locum Agency request form A revised process to request medical agency locum support is to be introduced from 1 April 2023. This aims to ensure effective governance over all medical agency locum engagements. The revised process ensures consistency across NHS Grampian through completion of standard engagement and extension forms along with a risk assessment for all medical agency locum engagements. Other changes include a standard approval framework and greater transparency over the rota gap to be filled and the rate at which a medical agency locum is being engaged. Pre-school immunisation – changes to the programme From 1 April 2023, Practitioner Services department (PSD) will no longer handle inputting any SIRS data (Immunisations or Health Surveillance). Instead, this will be carried out by the Community Child Health (CCH) team based in Argyll House, Aberdeen; Moray pre-school immunisations will be dealt with by existing Moray admin team.
