Coronation Public Holiday The coronation of King Charles III is due to take place on Saturday 6 May; Monday 8 May will be a public holiday to mark the occasion. The Scottish Government has confirmed Monday 8 May will be a public holiday in NHS Scotland. This is in addition to the Public Holidays already agreed for 2023. <u>Further information is available here</u> and attached to the email used to send out this brief for ease.

Royal Voluntary Service - service closures in Aberdeen City & Moray Royal Voluntary Service have informed us their Aberdeen City Transport Service, Aberdeen Supporting You at Home Service, and Moray transport and shopping services will close next month, due to a lack of available funding.
