Message from the Chief Executive Caroline Hiscox <u>has recorded this short message</u> to round off the week and reflect on the work she and her team have been undertaking this week.

Workplace relationships Back in November we shared some thoughts on the prospect of industrial action in the NHS, how this might impact on how we feel and what it might mean for our relationships with one another. The situation has moved on somewhat, so it is probably a good time to check in again. What was a possible pay offer has become the confirmed pay award for 2022/23, as seen in this week's pay packet (arrears to follow next month). For some of you this will be a relief, but for others this may create mixed, difficult, emotions, as it happened while your union or professional body remains in dispute. Although a number of unions have indicated they will not set dates for strike action while talks take place with all unions and professional organisations on a pay offer for the 2023/24 financial year, they have been clear it remains a step they are willing to take.

As we highlighted a few months ago, whatever the coming months may bring, we need to remember we will all continue to work together afterwards. We don't all think alike – wouldn't our workplaces be dull if we did? - and we won't all make the same choices. While disagreements are healthy, it is important to adhere to our core values and continue to treat each other with kindness and respect. This isn't mere lip service either; there is a growing body of evidence on the importance of civility in healthcare and this not only creates positive cultures but impacts positively on staff morale and patient care. Holocaust Memorial Day (HMD) Today is the anniversary of the liberation of the Auschwitz-Birkenau Nazi death camp. It is an international day of memorial for the six million Jews murdered during the Holocaust, alongside the millions of other people killed under Nazi persecution of other groups, and those murdered in more recent genocides in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia, and Darfur.

Every year the <u>Holocaust Memorial Day Trust</u> (HMDT) sets a theme for HMD and this year it is <u>Ordinary People</u>. We are all affected by the themes of HMD and within the NHS family, we have staff who have survived genocide and we have patients who may have survived genocide. We are all ordinary people, but we can be extraordinary in our actions. We can all make decisions at home, at work and in our day to day lives, to learn and remember. We can also be inspired to take action to challenge prejudice, stand up to hatred, and to speak out against identity-based persecution.
