16 Days of Action 2022: How Health Professionals identify Gender Based Violence (GBV) Individuals can present with, or disclose, Gender Based Violence in all parts of NHS Grampian. Some key areas of NHS Grampian must routinely make enquiries about GBV. Later this week, our Public Protection Midwife, Jenni Smith, will be discussing making these routine enquiries about abuse in those specific areas of the health service.

However, health professionals who do not work in these key areas must still be prepared that they will encounter someone experiencing GBV. Making selective enquiries about GBV is appropriate when acting on concerns that someone is experiencing GBV. This can be via observations of an individual's

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physical condition and/or their behaviour. It is therefore crucial that Health Professionals understand how GBV is defined and how they might recognise it in practice.
