Reverse Vending Machine - ARI Foyer Following the suspension of the Deposit Return Scheme across Scotland, the trial of the Reverse Vending Machine for cans and bottles, based in ARI foyer, will close on Friday 30 June, at the end of the working day. Please do not deposit any can or bottles in the machine after that date. We are so grateful to everyone who has used the machine since the trial began in mid-February. Over 19,000 drinks containers were put into the unit; a far higher number than we had expected and a great indication of your enthusiasm for recycling. The trial has given us a great insight into what will be required by our departments once the scheme does eventually come into place.
